ABSTRACT

One Health is an approach that promotes collaboration and communication with different disciplines and sectors at all levels to achieve better health outcomes for humans, animals, plants, and the environment, while recognizing their interconnections. **Circular Health** is an expanded philosophy that encompasses all the disciplines beyond the original definition in a broader and more dynamic concept.

The COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic is the perfect backdrop to teach the One Health and Circular Health concept. The One Health Center is therefore creating an interdisciplinary undergraduate course, “The Circular Nature of the 2020 COVID-19 Pandemic” to introduce students to the One Health approach and systems thinking, in order to better understand this historical, global event.

This 3-month fellowship has been developed for a graduate student to gain experience in the field of One Health, to master the circular health approach, and to understand how to engage other students in becoming proficient in developing innovative interdisciplinary approaches to empower the Circular Health vision. The student will prepare content for the course and will develop content for social media communications.

Dates of the fellowship will be from June 1st, 2020 to August 31st, 2020.

OBJECTIVES

To work with the One Health team in developing and teaching an undergraduate course in Circular Health and assist in social media communications about Circular Health.
